Engaging Texas Academic Institutions Strategic Plan 2019


Executive Summary

Academic and health department partnerships add value to public health through student and faculty engagement, practice-based research, workforce development and service to Texas communities.

Engaging Texas Academic Institutions is a DSHS Operational Plan project focusing on strengthening our relationships with academia. This project includes four phases:

- 1. <u>Assessment</u> to inform our engagement plan, including workgroup activities, SWOT analysis and staff survey.
- 2. <u>Strategic planning and development</u> to operationalize our strengths and opportunities with a clear and cohesive approach.
- 3. <u>Communication and outreach</u> to engage our academic partners with tangible projects and practical applications for collaboration.
- 4. Evaluation to measure if our efforts are making the desired change.

The Office of Academic Affairs established a cross-division workgroup to provide insight, expertise and ideas in developing a strategic plan for engaging academic partners. The workgroup developed goals and strategies for three priority areas:



Priority Area 1: Public Health Practice

DSHS will facilitate <u>public health in action</u> by:

- 1. Connecting the public health needs of the community with academic resources
- 2. Creating a platform to communicate, educate and disseminate public health practice activities
- 3. Replicating evidence-based projects, initiatives, and interventions to the broader system
- **Goal 1:** Connect the public health needs of the community with academic resources.

Strategies

- 1.1: Create an interactive GIS map of DSHS offices in relation to public health, medical/osteopathic, nursing, public policy, social work, informatics and communications schools
- 1.2: Conduct a needs assessment for DSHS, regional offices, and local health departments to inventory a list of projects that need support (research, quality improvement, community health assessments, survey development, or other public health needs)
- 1.3: Post opportunities by region on the DSHS Academic Affairs website
- 1.4: Host regional academic workshops to connect practice and academic partners
- **Goal 2:** Create a platform to communicate, educate and disseminate public health practice activities.

- 2.1: Encourage DSHS staff presentations at conferences (poster and break-out sessions) to highlight and disseminate public health interventions
- 2.2: Provide information to DSHS staff on opportunities to present their work (e.g., call for abstracts for conferences, webinar presentation opportunities)
- 2.3: Give students opportunities to pilot their ideas at DSHS (e.g., theses, dissertations, practicums)
- **Goal 3:** Replicate evidence-based projects, initiatives, and interventions to the broader system

Priority Area 2: Education and Learning

DSHS will achieve a <u>well-prepared</u>, fully trained and motivated public health <u>workforce</u> by:

- 1. Creating high value, high quality student learning experiences at DSHS
- 2. Bridging gaps between public health theory and practice
- 3. Facilitating connections between academic faculty and DSHS staff
- **Goal 1:** Create high value, high quality student learning experiences at DSHS

Strategies

- 1.1: Develop a yearly preceptor orientation and training
- 1.2: Develop toolkits for best practices in developing internship projects and supervisor/mentoring
- 1.3: Host interest group for new preceptors
- 1.4: Create incentives for hosting interns (e.g., administrative leave, travel/conference funds)
- 1.5: Increase number of paid internships
- 1.6: Create a standardized process for onboarding interns
- 1.7: Establish an orientation for all interns
- 1.8: Explore development of a DSHS fellowship
- 1.9: Explore development of public health rotation for medical students and/or medical residents
- 1.10: Add teaching and mentoring activities to performance measures
- **Goal 2:** Bridge gaps between public health theory and practice

Strategies

- 2.1: Identify areas where gaps exist between public health theory and practice
- 2.2: Identify DSHS staff with active university adjunct appointments
- 2.3: Encourage and facilitate DSHS staff participation in classroom learning through guest lecturing, real-world classroom projects, and consulting on curriculum development
- 2.4: Create a "public health 101" curriculum to deliver to undergraduate and graduate non-public health majors
- **Goal 3:** Facilitate connections between academic faculty and DSHS staff

- 3.1: Coordinate main campus and regional academic workshops to connect practice and academic partners
- 3.2: Identify a "Champion Academic Liaison" for each DSHS region/division
- 3.3: Identify a list of champions or liaisons at Texas universities
- 3.4: Discover how academia can train and support the professional development and education of DSHS staff
- 3.5: Education and recruiting activities on public health careers to classrooms, student groups or other events
- 3.6: Create a regular seminar series on public health practice with university and health department staff

Priority Area 3: Public Health Research

As faithful stewards of public resources, DSHS will utilize data to produce, advance and disseminate public health research, best practices and innovation by:

- 1. Educating and demonstrating the value of public health research
- 2. Building internal capacity for developing and understanding research
- 3. Improve collaboration with external research stakeholders

Goal 1: Educate and demonstrate the value of public health research

Strategies

- 1.1: Identify, clarify and educate on DSHS data
- 1.2: Inventory of DSHS led research
- 1.3: Education on how research impacts health of Texans, including case studies from DSHS
- 1.4: Press releases on DSHS research
- 1.5: Align research to strategic goals and health priorities
- **Goal 2:** Build internal capacity for developing and understanding research

Strategies

- 2.1 Develop research skills for DSHS staff on research through professional conferences and trainings
- 2.2 Revise position descriptions to allow for research
- 2.3 Performance measures tied to published, peer-reviewed research
- 2.4 Create an internal DSHS advisory council to inform DSHS research goals
- 2.5 Education for staff on the DSHS Institutional Review Board
- 2.6 Create research-related internships, fellowships or student projects
- **Goal 3:** Improve collaboration with external research stakeholders

- 3.1 Improve forms for data and research requests
- 3.2 Integration of DSHS data into classroom curriculum and projects
- 3.3 Create infographic on how to request data (e.g., decision trees, visuals)
